A National Call for Moral Revival

The Mass Poor People's Assembly and Moral March on Washington will be the largest gathering of poor, dispossessed and impacted people, faith leaders, and people of conscience. This year's gathering is digital and scheduled for 10am EDT Saturday June 20, 2020.

United, the campaign will move the moral and political imagination of society to redress injustices that force 43% of the nation (140M) to live without <u>health insurance</u>, <u>living wages</u>, <u>clean water</u>, and <u>voting protections</u>.

Dorothy's Kitchen

With Love, respect and compassion, Dorothy's Kitchen provides essential services and transitional support to people experiencing the injustice of homelessness and extreme poverty. Three facilities: Dorothy's Place, the Chinatown Health Services Center, and House of Peace – Jefferson Street, offer health services, a drop-in center, and a homeless shelter. Service teams are comprised of health workers, social workers, behavioral health and housing specialists to get people into permanent housing.

I-Help

Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program www.ihelpmontereybay.org

Usually a "rotating shelter" between several churches - one for men, and another for women. Now both groups are "sheltering in place" within two separate churches.

Volunteers continue to provide evening meals with appropriate safeguards. Increased costs arise from 24/7 staffing and transportation to a shower facility for the women's group, among other needs.

Tiny Homes in San Jose

San Jose City Council <u>approved funds for an</u> <u>emergency tiny homes</u> "bridge housing" village in District 2 for homeless community members, partnership with Destination Home and Habitat for Humanity.

Project Roomkey

This partnership with Governor Newsom and Motel 6 furthers "Project Roomkey" to protect homeless community members from COVID-19 by temporarily housing them in Motel 6 locations across the state.

Eviction and Rent Hike Moratoriums

<u>SJTenants</u>, affiliated with Silicon Valley Debug, clears up confusion surrounding tenants' rights in Santa Clara County. The website has a wealth of resources and support for tenants and landlords who want to understand policy changes due to COVID-19.
