Warm Greetings to You all,

As the season of Lent draws near, we are invited into a slower and more thoughtful time. Lent gives us space to pause, to take stock of our lives, and to consider how we are showing up for one another and for the world around us. It is a season that encourages honesty—about what we carry, what we need to let go of, and where we might be called to grow with renewed intention, care, and compassion.

This year, we enter Lent while so much around us feels heavy. Across the country, communities are grappling with fear, violence, and deep uncertainty. Being a Connectional Church Embodying Justice and Love

The incarnational witness of the Church at work.

On Thursday, January 22nd, Presbytery of San Jose teaching elders Rev. Trevor Van Laar, Elder Vicki Flower Minerva of Gilroy Presbyterian Church, EP Neal Presa, and members of the congregation accompanied Mathias, an asylum seeker from Cameroon, to the ICE field office at 630 Sansome Street in downtown San Francisco.

Mathias came to the U.S. legally in 2022 and awaited a court hearing. In the meantime, he did his annual check-in appointments with ICE. He waited and checked the immigration computer system and suddenly May 2025, the computer system indicated his case was dismissed without any pre-notification nor a reason. He was in limbo until Dec 2025 when the computer

system indicated he was to appear on January 22, 2026 at the ICE detention center in downtown San Francisco. He and his attorney feared he would be detained, and subsequently deported.

Gilroy Presbyterian Church members joined together in prayer and donated well over \$20K toward his legal defense.

The notorious 630 Sansome Street Building, known in U.S. immigration history as the second Angel Island, where many immigrants were detained and during the Chinese Exclusion Act, many Chinese/Chinese Americans were detained in this building.

The group from the Presbytery stood in line for four hours and when Mathias and his attorney finally went inside, the Presbytery group waited outside and sang hymns and fellowshiped. Mathias and other Cameroonian members in the group were members of the Presbyterian Church in Cameroon. EP Presa learned that Mama Odilia Ndze, who is visiting here from Cameroon, was a member of the PCC's Synod executive committee so they chatted about polity and the happenings in Cameroon.

EP Presa met his former seminary classmate Rev. Ben Daniel, who serves as co-moderator of Presbytery of San Francisco and pastor of Montclair Presbyterian Church and who formerly was a pastor in San Jose Presbytery. Ben's presence connected our Presbytery group with our siblings of San Francisco Presbytery. Ben came to join our Presbytery group, as he also participated in a faith leaders' gathering at the City Hall of San Francisco where Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow addressed the crowd; Bruce is on the board of the Interfaith Movement for Human Dignity, which organized that gathering.

After waiting for nearly an hour and a half, Mathias appeared with joy and everyone hugged and huddled together.

Mathias was granted a six-month extension and will receive a scheduled hearing with the immigration court after a four-year-long wait.

Thanks be to God! Let us continue praying for Mathias, for the scheduling of the court hearing, that he will be granted asylum, for his family in Cameroon, and for all persons in the U.S. and around the world who are seeking asylum and who live in vulnerability and fear.




The photo above will be the cover image of the devotional booklet. It is a mosaic from Trinity Presbyterian Church-San José.

A report issued November 20, 2025 by the American Immigration Council indicated that without the benefit of an attorney at immigration court proceedings, people in our Presbytery have a 70% chance of being deported, often erroneously.

In response to this, the Presbytery's Peace and Justice Working Group has worked with EP Neal Presa to establish a free will offering initiative to support crucial legal counsel for people facing the threat of deportation. The Working Group and Presbytery staff have identified Peacemaking Offering and other related special funds that can provide up to \$15,000 in matching funds. This initiative will run through Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2026.

- They transform the world by the power of the Holy Spirit.


Through these commitments, the congregation nurtures spiritual growth, discipleship, and engagement with God's work in the world.

Upcoming Required Boundary Trainings

The Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow (member at-large) will again facilitate required Boundary Training for ruling elders and teaching elders on Saturday, April 18 and Saturday, November 7.

The pattern for both days are:

9:00am-10:00 | Online for ruling elders

10:00-11:00 | Break

11:00-1:00pm | In-Person for teaching elders (with lunch included) held at the Presbytery Office/Cornerstone Church of Silicon Valley chapel at 890 Meridian Avenue in San José



This boundary training addresses maintaining safe and healthy ministry relationships, with such topics as power dynamics, financial boundaries, social media, pastoral care and counseling relationships, self-care and well-being.

Boundary training is mandatory, required by the Book of Order (G-3.0106), focusing on sexual misconduct, harassment, and child abuse prevention for clergy, session members, and church leaders to maintain safe, healthy ministry relationships. This training, usually every three years, covers professional conduct, technology use, and clear roles

To complete boundary training to address sexual misconduct, harassment, and child abuse prevention, you may utilize the Presbytery account with "Darkness to Light," which can be used anytime, contact EP Neal Presa or Stated Clerk Erica Rader.

Note, both sets of boundary training are required: (1) Addressing safe and healthy ministry relationships and (2) Addressing sexual misconduct, harassment, and child abuse prevention. While both sets are, of course, interrelated, there are distinct foci that are addressed and which all teaching and ruling elders are required to learn and engage.



Training for Treasurers and Finance Chairs May 2nd, 9:30am-12:00pm

Our Presbytery Treasurer, Rev. Edd Breeden, will facilitate an annual workshop that covers the fundamentals of serving as a church treasurer, a finance chair or on a church finance committee. The workshop will be held in-person on Saturday, May 2 from 9:30am-12:00pm at the chapel of the Presbytery Office/Cornerstone Church of Silicon Valley at 890 Meridian Way in San José.
