

2026 Lent-Easter Devotional Booklet



A report issued November 20, 2025 by the American Immigration Council indicated that without the benefit of an attorney at immigration court proceedings, people in our Presbytery have a 70% chance of being deported, often erroneously.

In response to this, the Presbytery's Peace and Justice Working Group has worked with EP Neal Presa to establish a free will offering initiative to support crucial legal counsel for people facing the threat of deportation. The Working Group and Presbytery staff have identified Peacemaking Offering and other related special funds that can provide up to \$15,000 in matching funds. This initiative will run through Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2026.

This coming Sunday, January 11, please pray for the members of Westhope Presbyterian Church in Saratoga, and their pastor, The Rev. Erik Swanson.



Westhope Church lives out and embodies God's transformative justice as a leader in immigration justice in the Presbytery, gender justice as a More Light congregation, environmental care, social justice, and in other dimensions and arenas of working for and praying towards a more just world. Westhope's Session spearheaded the authoring of an overture which our Presbytery approved last October and which has been transmitted to the 227th General Assembly (2026) on addressing Christian Nationalism.

Announcing Dates for Required Boundary Trainings

The Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow (member at-large) will again facilitate required Boundary Training for ruling elders and teaching elders on Saturday, April 18 and Saturday, November 7.

The pattern both days are:

9:00am-10:00 | Online for ruling elders
10:00-11:00 | Break
11:00-1:00pm | In-Person for teaching elders (with lunch included)

Registration information is forthcoming.

Boundary training is mandatory, required by the Book of Order (G-3.0106), focusing on sexual misconduct, harassment, and child abuse prevention for clergy, session members, and church leaders to maintain safe, healthy ministry relationships. This training, usually every three years, covers professional conduct, technology use, and clear roles
