Dear Members and Friends of the Presbytery of San José,

Grace and peace to you in the midst of our life together as the Church. For this week's Digest, Colin Richardson, our Communications Coordinator, offers the following reflection:

Greetings to you all as we near the end of our Lenten journey. With Holy Week now quickly approaching, this season invites us more intentionally into spiritual preparation — a turning of the heart toward reflection, humility, and the deep love revealed in Christ's journey to the cross.

As we move closer to these sacred days, we are reminded that preparation is not only found in grand gestures, but also in quiet, daily practices. Offering kindness — both to ourselves and to others — becomes one meaningful way we live into this season. In extending compassion to our neighbors, we begin to align our lives more closely with the love that Holy Week proclaims.

In preparation for the spirit of solidarity reflected in the coming week's Daily Lectionary readings, I offer this quote from a beloved figure in the Presbyterian tradition, whose remembrance day falls this Friday, March 20th. Mr. Rogers—celebrated television host and ordained Presbyterian minister—once wrote, “I believe that appreciation is a holy thing—that when we look for what's best in a person we happen to be with at the moment, we're doing what God does all the time. So in loving and appreciating our neighbor, we're participating in something sacred.” His words offer a simple but profound reminder: to see others with care and dignity is itself a sacred act.

In these remaining weeks of Lent, as we stand in solidarity with Christ's suffering and prepare our hearts for Easter, may we practice this kind of holy appreciation. In doing so, we participate in the sacred work of love that leads us toward the hope of resurrection.

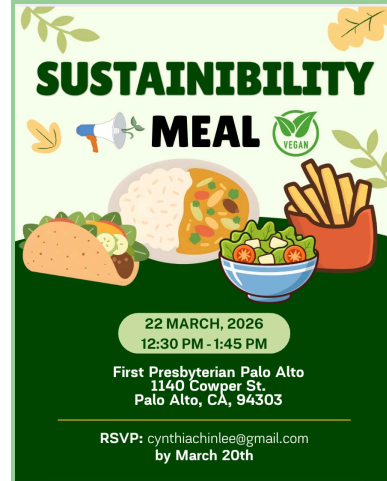
**Sustainability Meal Event**

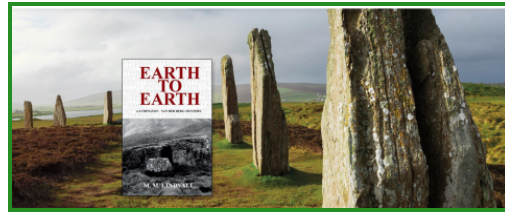

## ***Clergy Reminders***

### **Board of Pensions Update:** **Spring Board Bulletin Now Available**

The Board of Pensions has released its Spring 2026 Board Bulletin, highlighting several new initiatives to strengthen financial and family support for pastors and congregations.



Among the updates, effective January 1, 2027, the Board approved a **50% subsidy for dependent children covered under the Congregational Pastors’ Package**, a **two-year extension of Transitional Pastor’s Participation**, and a new **childcare support grant**. In addition, effective July 1, 2026, the Board of Directors granted a

**7.2% experience apportionment for the Defined Benefit Pension Plan**, the largest experience apportionment approved to date.

### Required Boundary Training for Elders: *Healthy Ministry Relationships* April 18th, 9:00 am-1:00 pm

The Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow (member at-large) will again facilitate required Boundary Training for ruling elders and teaching elders on Saturday, April 18 and Saturday, November 7.

The pattern for both days are:

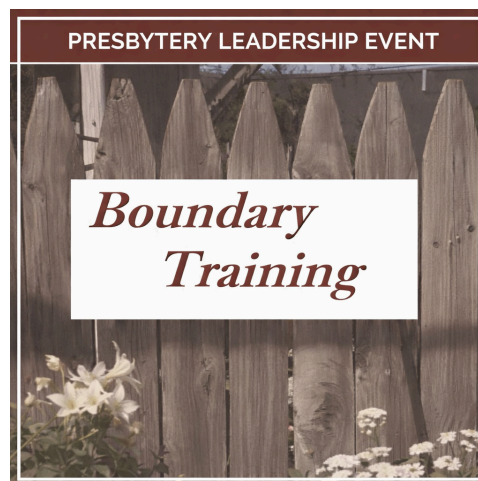
9:00am-10:00 | Online for ruling elders

10:00-11:00 | Break

11:00-1:00pm | In-Person for teaching elders (with lunch included) held at the Presbytery Office/Cornerstone Church of Silicon Valley chapel at 890 Meridian Avenue in San José

This boundary training addresses maintaining safe and healthy ministry relationships, with such topics as power dynamics, financial boundaries, social media, pastoral care and counseling relationships, self-care and well-being.



## Reminder:

Teaching elders (clergy) must complete either the Presbytery's in-person training with Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow or the online SafeGatherings training. Ruling elders may attend the Presbytery training or complete another Session-approved boundary training, as Sessions determine how to meet that requirement.

### Please Note:

In addition to the Teaching Elder/Ruling Elder Boundary Training, all elders are also required to complete **Child Protection Training**, as mandated by the Book of Order (G-3.0106). While child protection is certainly a critical boundary concern, we distinguish between these two requirements because they address different areas of ministry responsibility and must each be completed.

Child Protection Training focuses specifically on preventing sexual misconduct and harassment, abuse awareness, and reporting responsibilities. Each Session determines how this training is delivered for leaders and volunteers. The Presbytery recommends "Darkness to Light: Stewards of Children" (in-person or online), though other approved curricula may be used. Completing one training does not fulfill the other — both are required.

If anyone wishes to use Darkness to Light (whether the online or in-person version), they should first contact EP Neal Presa (Neal@sanjosepby.org).

### February/March Edition

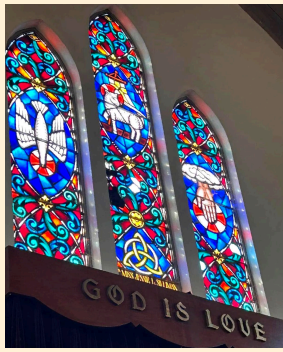
I have now been serving as Peacemaking and Justice Advocate for one month. My first goal, perhaps a bit lofty but an ongoing project, is to get acquainted with the 30+ congregations, fellowships, and worshipping communities in our presbytery. If we haven't made contact yet – I hope to soon, and invite you to reach out with any peace/justice related ministries, partnerships, or events you'd like to promote, questions you might have, or concerns on your heart.

I am coming to understand my advocacy role as someone who helps create "onramps for engagement" (thanks, Rev. Bryan Franzen for the catchphrase). I'm endeavoring to learn about the diverse churches and regions of the presbytery to be able to lift up examples of congregations, nonprofits, businesses, pastors and community leaders who are doing important peacebuilding work. Each month in my "Pieces on Peace", I'll highlight something impactful that I've encountered, in the hopes that it might inspire others to learn more, collaborate, start something new, or lean into important work they're already doing.

As I myself learn more and get involved with on-the-ground peace work in our presbytery, I hope to also serve as "connective tissue" (metaphor credit: Rev. Erik Swanson), able to transmit information, relay resources, and get folks connected around justice-oriented efforts. Connective tissue must be flexible, responsive and communicative for coordination, and has to be healthy to keep other parts operating at their best. I am here to advocate, support, encourage, and participate in the peacemaking work of the children of God in thought, word, and deed – and I look forward to partnering with you in God's unfolding project of peace!

### Westview Presbyterian Church - Watsonville

This week, we invite you to pray for Westview Presbyterian Church of Watsonville, and for their pastor, **Rev. Dan Hoffman**, as well as the many members and volunteers who faithfully sustain their ministry and outreach in the community.

Westview Presbyterian Church is guided by a clear and meaningful vision: to lead people to Jesus and into the fellowship of His family, to grow in Christ's likeness, and to offer their gifts in ministry — all for the purpose of glorifying and enjoying God forever. This vision shapes a congregation committed to spiritual growth and active service within its greater community.

At the heart of Westview's life together is a desire to cultivate faith through worship, learning, and mutual support. The congregation gathers each Sunday at 10:00 a.m. for in-person worship, with an additional option to join through their Zoom Sunday Online Gathering, extending fellowship beyond physical walls. Midweek, members reconnect through "Midweek Recharge," a time of scripture reflection, prayer, and encouragement held Wednesdays at 4:00 p.m. via Zoom.

Westview also fosters creativity and community through ministries like the Sew Fun Sewing Circle, where participants gather on Tuesday mornings to share skills in quilting, clothing construction, and other fabric arts while building meaningful relationships. Beyond the church walls, their commitment to service is evident in SonRise Kitchen, which provides breakfast five days a week to neighbors in need.

Additionally, Westview spearheaded HOPE Village (otherwise known as Tiny Village), a recently constructed transitional housing center that serves unhoused individuals and also provides intensive case management related to job placement, mental health, legal and immigration services. There are currently 32 individuals being supported through these efforts, & Westview hopes to expand capacity and access in the coming months.

As Westview Presbyterian Church continues to live out its mission of guiding, growing, giving, and going, we give thanks for their faithful witness in Watsonville. We ask that you hold Rev. Hoffman and the entire congregation in prayer this week

— that their ministries may continue to flourish, and that their work may reflect God's love in both word and action.

## Work Group Spotlight: Legal Aid Initiative

A report issued November 20, 2025 by the American Immigration Council indicated that without the benefit of an attorney at immigration court proceedings, people in our Presbytery have a 70% chance of being deported, often erroneously.

In response to this, the Presbytery's **Peace and Justice Working Group** has worked with EP Neal Presa to establish a free will offering initiative to support crucial legal counsel for people facing the threat of deportation. The Working Group and Presbytery staff have identified Peacemaking Offering and other related special funds that can provide up to \$15,000 in matching funds. This initiative will run through Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2026.

We invite you to give generously to two organizations in urgent need:

- Amigos Center Rapid Response Network of Santa Clara County
- The Santa Cruz Community Action Board

Your support helps ensure access to legal counsel and a fair day in court for our immigrant neighbors.

### **Fundraising Updates:**

Thanks to the generosity of our congregations and partners, this initiative has continued to exceed expectations. As of **March 3**, more than **\$30,000** has been raised from over **120+ donors**, unlocking the full \$15,000 in matching funds. The new total includes an additional \$1760 received from the Community Action Board of Santa Cruz since our last Fundraiser update. This remarkable outpouring of generosity reflects the shared commitment across our community to invest in meaningful, lasting impact.

We give thanks for the compassion and commitment shown across our Presbytery, and we encourage continued support through May 24, 2026, as we work together to uphold dignity, justice, and mercy for our immigrant neighbors.
