Dear Members and Friends of the Presbytery of San José,

Grace and peace to you in the midst of our life together as the Church. For this week's Digest, Colin Richardson, our Communications Coordinator, offers the following reflection:

Greetings to you as we continue walking this Lenten path together — a season that invites us to practice intention in the midst of the challenges and distractions that arise with each passing day. This season calls us to slow down, to reflect, and to consider how prayer, fasting, and renewed attention to God shape the way we move through a complicated world.

As events in the Middle East continue to unfold and tensions grow between nations, we are once again reminded of the deep human cost that accompanies conflict. Moments like these confront us with the reality of continued suffering and uncertainty experienced by countless people across the region and beyond. For our community, such times call us not only to observe what is happening in the world, but also to reflect prayerfully on how people of faith are called to respond when violence and instability arise.

The Christian tradition has long wrestled with the difficult questions that surface in moments like these: how to name injustice while remaining committed to peace, how to seek accountability without abandoning reconciliation. While the answers are rarely simple, our faith reminds us that true security does not ultimately rest in force or power, but in the patient work of justice, mercy, and peacemaking. We pray for wisdom among leaders and for the safety and dignity of all people affected as events continue to unfold.

During this season of Lenten fasting, we might also reflect on the many ways we are invited to fast—not only from food, but from indifference and resignation to the suffering around us. These practices draw our attention back to what matters most, reminding us to remain attentive in prayer and compassionate in action. As we continue this Lenten journey together, may our faith keep us grounded in hope, guiding us to respond to the world's challenges with humility, courage, and a renewed commitment to the peace Christ teaches.




**\*Stone Church of Willow Glen Presents:

### **Required Boundary Training for Elders: *Healthy Ministry Relationships* April 18th, 9:00 am-1:00 pm**

The Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow (member at-large) will again facilitate required Boundary Training for ruling elders and teaching elders on Saturday, April 18 and Saturday, November 7.

The pattern for both days are:



This boundary training addresses maintaining safe and healthy ministry relationships, with such topics as power dynamics, financial boundaries, social



**Reminder:**

Teaching elders (clergy) must complete either the Presbytery's in-person training with Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow or the online SafeGatherings training. Ruling elders may attend the Presbytery training or complete another Session-approved boundary training, as Sessions determine how to meet that requirement.

**Please Note:**

In addition to the Teaching Elder/Ruling Elder Boundary Training, all elders are also required to complete **Child Protection Training**, as mandated by the Book of Order (G-3.0106). While child protection is certainly a critical boundary concern, we distinguish between these two requirements because they address different areas of ministry responsibility and must each be completed.

Child Protection Training focuses specifically on preventing sexual misconduct and harassment, abuse awareness, and reporting responsibilities. Each Session determines how this training is delivered for leaders and volunteers. The Presbytery recommends "Darkness to Light: Stewards of Children" (in-person or online), though other approved curricula may be used. Completing one training does not fulfill the other — both are required.

Our Presbytery Treasurer, Rev. Edd Breeden, will facilitate an annual workshop that covers the fundamentals of serving as a church treasurer, a finance chair or on a church finance committee. EP Neal Presa recently had a lunch meeting with our BOP regional consultant Christine Long, together with Kenneth Green, the BOP regional consultant for the Midwest and Plain states, and Kristin Leucht, the BOP regional senior consultant for Southern California and the Rocky Mountain states. They reminded three things:



- Teaching elders and church administrators: be sure to update with the BOP any changes to effective salary. Your pension credits and other benefits, such as death and disability, are based on whatever effective salary is on record with the BOP. The BOP does not retroactively correct or apply effective salary that has not been updated.
- Teaching elders: if you think you will be retiring in the next 10-15 years, you are strongly advise to attend a THRIVE seminar, which covers comprehensive topics, such as financial planning and healthcare options. *February/March Edition*


I have now been serving as Peacemaking and Justice Advocate for one month. My first goal, perhaps a bit lofty but an ongoing project, is to get acquainted with the 30+ congregations, fellowships, and worshipping communities in our presbytery. If we haven't made contact yet – I hope to soon, and invite you to reach out with any peace/justice related ministries, partnerships, or events you'd like to promote, questions you might have, or concerns on your heart.

I am coming to understand my advocacy role as someone who helps create "onramps for engagement" (thanks, Rev. Bryan Franzen for the catchphrase). I'm endeavoring to learn about the diverse churches and regions of the presbytery to be able to lift up examples of congregations, nonprofits, businesses, pastors and community leaders who are doing important peacebuilding work. Each month in my "Pieces on Peace", I'll highlight something impactful that I've encountered, in the

hopes that it might inspire others to learn more, collaborate, start something new, or lean into important work they're already doing.

As I myself learn more and get involved with on-the-ground peace work in our presbytery, I hope to also serve as “connective tissue” (metaphor credit: Rev. Connective tissue must be flexible, responsive and communicative for coordination, and has to be healthy to keep other parts operating at their best. I am here to advocate, support, encourage, and participate in the peacemaking work of the children of God in thought, word, and deed – and I look forward to partnering with you in God's unfolding project of peace!

## **Bonny Doon Presbyterian Church**

This week, we invite you to pray for Bonny Doon Church and Pastor Edd Breeden as they continue to nurture a loving, Christ-centered presence in the Santa Cruz community.

Bonny Doon Church's vision is simple and wholehearted: to be a loving community, experiencing God and communicating the life-changing teachings of Jesus Christ. Their ministry flows from this vision into tangible acts of care — loving neighbors not only in word, but in action. Whether helping with fire recovery, hosting community art and craft fairs, or offering a warm cup of coffee and conversation at Higher Grounds Coffeehouse, their life together reflects a faith that shows up.

In the wake of the CZU Lightning Complex fires, Bonny Doon Church established Beautiful Day, an annual work day serving families who lost their homes. This ministry comes alongside those who are under-insured, widowed, single parents, facing health challenges, or carrying additional burdens after total loss. Through practical service and steady presence, the church bears witness to hope by reminding neighbors they are not forgotten.

Bonny Doon Church is marked by generosity, hospitality, and grassroots involvement. Higher Grounds Coffeehouse, their donation-only café, is lovingly staffed by local volunteers and serves homemade goods alongside fresh-brewed coffee. It has become a gathering place where community is built through kindness and conversation alike.

Their shared life centers on Sunday worship at 10:00 a.m. Throughout the week, the Coffeehouse is open Thursdays from 9:00–11:00 a.m. and Sundays following the 10:00 a.m. service. The church also hosts bi-weekly coffee and community gatherings on Thursdays and Saturdays from 9:00–11:00 a.m. Women's Bible Study meets in person every Thursday from 3:00–4:30 p.m., offering space for study, encouragement, and spiritual growth.

In all they do — from worship to service to shared tables — Bonny Doon Church seeks to embody a faith that is lived out and a hope that is practical in impacting their surrounding community.

## Leaders of Color Retreat October 19-22, 2026 Zephyr Point Conference Center





## Work Group Spotlight: Legal Aid Initiative

A report issued November 20, 2025 by the American Immigration Council indicated that without the benefit of an attorney at immigration court proceedings, people in our Presbytery have a 70% chance of being deported, often erroneously.

In response to this, the Presbytery's **Peace and Justice Working Group** has worked with EP Neal Presa to establish a free will offering initiative to support crucial legal counsel for people facing the threat of deportation. The Working Group and Presbytery staff have identified Peacemaking Offering and other related special funds that can provide up to \$15,000 in matching funds. This initiative will run through Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2026.

We invite you to give generously to two organizations in urgent need:

- Amigos Center Rapid Response Network of Santa Clara County
- The Santa Cruz Community Action Board

Your support helps ensure access to legal counsel and a fair day in court for our immigrant neighbors.

### **Fundraising Updates:**

Thanks to the generosity of our congregations and partners, this initiative has continued to exceed expectations. As of **March 3**, more than **\$30,000** has been raised from over **120+ donors**, unlocking the full \$15,000 in matching funds. The new total includes an additional \$1760 received from the Community Action Board of Santa Cruz since our last Fundraiser update. This remarkable outpouring of generosity reflects the shared commitment across our community to invest in meaningful, lasting impact.

We give thanks for the compassion and commitment shown across our Presbytery, and we encourage continued support through May 24, 2026, as we work together to uphold dignity, justice, and mercy for our immigrant neighbors.
