Dear Members and Friends of the Presbytery of San José,

Grace and peace to you in the midst of our life together as the Church. For this week's Digest, Colin Richardson, our Communications Coordinator, offers the following reflection:

Greetings to you all as we prepare to enter Holy Week, marked by the observation of Palm Sunday. This day carries a sense of movement and emotion — a gathering crowd, branches raised, voices calling out “Hosanna.” It is a word filled with longing, a prayer for things to be made right. In many ways, it echoes the quiet hopes we hold in our own lives, the places where we are waiting for change, for healing, or for a sign that God is near.

Palm Sunday also invites a kind of honest reflection. The energy of celebration does not last forever, and the story quickly shifts in ways the crowd did not expect. That movement can feel familiar. There are moments when faith feels clear and full of hope, and others when uncertainty settles in. This day asks us to notice how we respond in both — where we turn, what we hold onto, and how we remain present when things feel unresolved.

As our Lenten journey soon comes to a close, we are encouraged to move at a different pace. Holy Week is not simply something to observe, but something to inhabit. It unfolds slowly, inviting us to pay attention to God's presence in the midst of our daily lives. This may take shape in quiet moments of reflection, or in brief acts of care that are small but meaningful. In these practices, our awareness begins to deepen.

We do not walk this path alone. As a community, we begin with “Hosanna,” carrying both our hopes and our questions. The days ahead invite us to remain open to how Christ meets us along the way. In doing so, we allow this week to shape not only what we believe, but how we live with one another.

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) recently announced that its Interim Unified Agency has been renamed to **Presbyterian Life & Witness**.

Originally established in 2022, the agency's new name reflects a revitalized focus on advancing mission and ministry priorities. Its work centers on supporting mid councils, developing leaders, strengthening and unifying ministry efforts, advancing reparative justice, nurturing the life of the church, and building strategic partnerships. 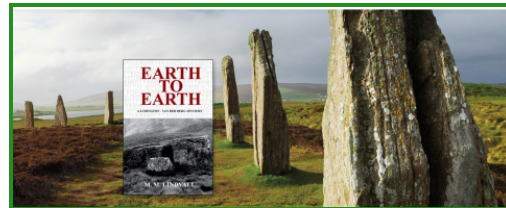

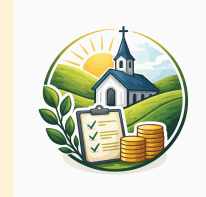

## Clergy Reminders

### **Board of Pensions Update: Spring Board Bulletin Now Available**



The Board of Pensions has released its Spring 2026 Board Bulletin, highlighting several new initiatives to strengthen financial and family support for pastors and congregations.

Among the updates, effective January 1, 2027, the Board approved a **50% subsidy for dependent children covered under the Congregational Pastors' Package**, a **two-year extension of Transitional Pastor's Participation**, and a new **childcare support grant**. In addition, effective July 1, 2026, the Board of Directors granted a **7.2% experience apportionment for the Defined Benefit Pension Plan**, the largest experience apportionment approved to date.

**Required Boundary Training for Elders:**

***Healthy Ministry Relationships***

**April 18th, 9:00 am-1:00 pm**

The Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow (member at-large) will again facilitate required Boundary Training for ruling elders and teaching elders on Saturday, April 18 and Saturday, November 7.

The pattern for both days are:

9:00am-10:00 | Online for ruling elders

10:00-11:00 | Break

11:00-1:00pm | In-Person for teaching elders (with lunch included) held at the Presbytery Office/Cornerstone Church of Silicon Valley chapel at 890 Meridian Avenue in San José

This boundary training addresses maintaining safe and healthy ministry relationships, with such topics as power dynamics, financial boundaries, social media, pastoral care and counseling relationships, self-care and well-being.

**Reminder:**

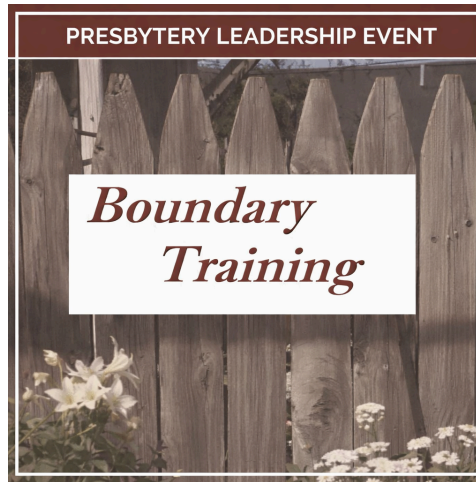
Teaching elders (clergy) must complete either the Presbytery's in-person training with Rev. Bruce Reyes-Chow or the online SafeGatherings training. Ruling elders may attend the Presbytery training or complete another Session-approved boundary training, as Sessions determine how to meet that requirement.

**Please Note:**

In addition to the Teaching Elder/Ruling Elder Boundary Training, all elders are also required to complete **Child Protection Training**, as mandated by the Book of Order (G-3.0106). While child protection is certainly a critical boundary concern, we distinguish between these two requirements because they address different areas of ministry responsibility and must each be completed.

Child Protection Training focuses specifically on preventing sexual misconduct and harassment, abuse awareness, and reporting responsibilities. Each Session determines how this training is delivered for leaders and volunteers. The Presbytery recommends "Darkness to Light: Stewards of Children" (in-person or online), though other approved curricula may be used. Completing one training does not fulfill the other — both are required.

### **Reflections by Veronica Ota, Peacemaking & Justice Advocate**

#### *February/March Edition*

I have now been serving as Peacemaking and Justice Advocate for one month. My first goal, perhaps a bit lofty but an ongoing project, is to get acquainted with the 30+ congregations, fellowships, and worshipping communities in our presbytery. If we haven't made contact yet – I hope to soon, and invite you to reach out with any peace/justice related ministries, partnerships, or events you'd like to promote, questions you might have, or concerns on your heart.

I am coming to understand my advocacy role as someone who helps create "onramps for engagement" (thanks, Rev. Bryan Franzen for the catchphrase). I'm endeavoring to learn about the diverse churches and regions of the presbytery to be able to lift up examples of congregations, nonprofits, businesses, pastors and community leaders who are doing important peacebuilding work. Each month in my "Pieces on Peace", I'll highlight something impactful that I've encountered, in the hopes that it might inspire others to learn more, collaborate, start something new, or lean into important work they're already doing.

As I myself learn more and get involved with on-the-ground peace work in our presbytery, I hope to also serve as "connective tissue" (metaphor credit: Rev. Erik Swanson), able to transmit information, relay resources, and get folks connected around justice-oriented efforts. Connective tissue must be flexible, responsive and communicative for coordination, and has to be healthy to keep other parts operating at their best. I am here to advocate, support, encourage, and participate in the peacemaking work of the children of God in thought, word, and

deed – and I look forward to partnering with you in God's unfolding project of peace!

Somos Watsonville is guided by a vision that is both simple and deeply meaningful: to create a space that feels open, welcoming, and shared. Rooted in the belief that all people are sacred, Somos exists not only to offer a physical space, but also to provide a sense of community for those in need of a third space where they can feel safe and welcomed. At its core, Somos is a nonprofit coffee shop and gathering space for young people and their families. Here, individuals can connect and receive support in an environment aimed at fostering "spiritual and emotional wholeness."

Throughout the week, the shop is shaped by events and interests of the surrounding community. Opportunities for tutoring and homework help sit alongside community events, creative workshops, and informal conversations. Somos also opens its doors to those who wish to host gatherings — student groups, book clubs, concerts, and other shared experiences that bring people together in authentic ways.

Beyond its location in Watsonville, Somos continues to grow through partnerships and the steady presence of volunteers who offer their time and gifts. Some mentor young people, others help organize events, and support daily operations. Each act of participation strengthens the sense of community that defines the space. Those who wish to get involved can do so in many ways, including volunteering, hosting events, or offering financial support to help sustain this ongoing work.

As Somos Watsonville continues to nurture a place where people can gather and belong, we give thanks for its presence in the community. We ask that you hold Julie, the leadership team, and all who are part of Somos in prayer this week — that their work may continue to grow and flourish in the years to come.

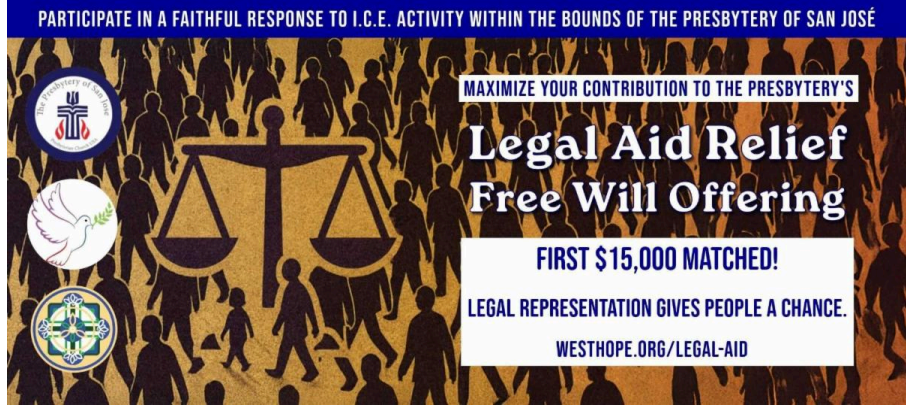

## Work Group Spotlight: Legal Aid Initiative

A report issued November 20, 2025 by the American Immigration Council indicated that without the benefit of an attorney at immigration court proceedings, people in our Presbytery have a 70% chance of being deported, often erroneously.

In response to this, the Presbytery's **Peace and Justice Working Group** has worked with EP Neal Presa to establish a free will offering initiative to support crucial legal counsel for people facing the threat of deportation. The Working Group and Presbytery staff have identified Peacemaking Offering and other related special funds that can provide up to \$15,000 in matching funds. This initiative will run through Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2026.

We invite you to give generously to two organizations in urgent need:

- Amigos Center Rapid Response Network of Santa Clara County
- The Santa Cruz Community Action Board

Your support helps ensure access to legal counsel and a fair day in court for our immigrant neighbors.

### **Fundraising Updates:**

Thanks to the generosity of our congregations and partners, this initiative has continued to exceed expectations. As of **March 3**, more than **\$30,000** has been raised from over **120+ donors**, unlocking the full \$15,000 in matching funds. The new total includes an additional \$1760 received from the Community Action Board of Santa Cruz since our last Fundraiser update. This remarkable outpouring of generosity reflects the shared commitment across our community to invest in meaningful, lasting impact.

We give thanks for the compassion and commitment shown across our Presbytery, and we encourage continued support through May 24, 2026, as we work together to uphold dignity, justice, and mercy for our immigrant neighbors.
